Purpose

Interviews. Although interviews were conducted with a focus on clinical activities of the faculty of ECU health science related programs, this document will specifically discuss information that was obtained regarding the research and education components.

General

- *Lydia Hammer, Johnathan Bailey and Frances Beard – KSA – conducted interviews with key faculty and staff to determine visioning, physical space goals/needs, and overall Health Sciences Campus considerations, specifically related to clinical/patient care activities.*

Discussion on Research

- Family Medicine
 - Has many grants. \$1.4 million/year
- Rehab
 - Stated they do not have enough research dollars, but that it is a goal to significantly increase this funding.
 - They would like to build Rehab Research Center with their Allied Health peers – part of a 10-year plan.
- Oncology
 - Do not do a lot of research currently.
- Internal Medicine
 - Still responsible for HemOnc research (clinical piece no longer part of the Internal Medicine Dept).
- Mental Health
 - Not a large NIH funded Dept.
 - Do not have labs for research.

Discussion on Education

- Family Medicine
 - Would like to grow from 10 residents to 12 per year, which will require 1 more faculty member.
 - The new Family Medicine Clinic building will have 6 classrooms (versus 1 that the current building has). The classrooms will serve as student education space, as well as be used for limited group patient care (i.e., diabetes education).
- Surgery
 - Teaching is not just in the classroom, students travel to the Hospital and other locations for learning.
 - Plans to recruit 3 additional faculty in Pediatric Surgery and 2 in Neurosurgery.
 - Current full time faculty: 28
- Pathology/Lab
 - Would like to recruit more faculty, but does not have the space for them.
 - Most Pathology/Lab Fellows are employed through the hospital. BSOM employs those Fellows that are not from an accredited program.
 - Current full time faculty: 24
- William Bagnell
 - Current BSOM only big enough to house 80 students – not sufficient for 120 students.
 - Looking at a phased renovation of existing BSOM space – maybe use existing space for research.
 - Desire to have a BSOM building solely for academic purposes – have a separate location(s) for clinical and research.

- OB/GYN
 - Current faculty: 18 MDs, 3 midwives, 1 PhD, 1 ultrasound, 2 NPs.
 - Would like space to accommodate teaching of residents at the Brody Clinic
 - Would like teaching and private pay patients seen in one building.
 - Within OB, they have group patient education/care. They need a room for small group patient education (to accommodate 10-12 people).
 - OB/Gyn conducts consults that involve students as part of the care team for education and teaching. They currently do not have enough space to hold these consults. They need a consultation room that would be big enough for 3-4 people.
 - Need educational space for midwives – have a training program at ECU.
- Rehab
 - Would like office space in BSOM to be close to other peers.
- Oncology
 - Do not have a residency program.
 - Challenge: Radiation Oncology has not been a major focus of BSOM - What is the strategy going forward for this Department?
 - Gyn Onc has one faculty member and he/she is leaving ECU in October.
 - Future education of students and residents must be considered in planning for Cancer Center services.
 - Currently have a co-op graduate program for clinical education – work with the Dept of Physics on the main campus. (These students travel to BSOM Cancer Center location). They need space – they currently run classes in a conference room. There is a potential to grow this program also.
- Internal Medicine
 - Currently has 70 faculty members, 50 residents, 25 fellows. They are partnering with the Hospital, which would enable them to obtain ~10 additional faculty.
- Gary Vanderpool
 - Allied Health would like to offer a Respiratory Therapy program.
 - Also interest in building a Dental Hygiene program.
 - Need space to add additional programs.
- Kathy Barger
 - PCMH would support BSOM's desire to add programs to its portfolio, but the hospital would not actively participate in developing these programs unless it saw a gap in services provided at its institution.
 - Cancer program is lacking – needs to grow. Hospital needs to work with BSOM to build a comprehensive Cancer Center.
 - Campus plans should not lose sight of the patient – need a specific flow for patients.
- Mental Health
 - Currently have 19 full time faculty. Need to add ~6 more between now and September – need office space.
 - There are 3 training programs for Post Medical School students:
 - Adult: have 24 students in program at any given time
 - Internal Medicine: have 10 students in program at any given time
 - Child: have 4 students in program at any given time

- General
 - Discussions around potentially adding Depts of Orthopedics, Radiology, and Anesthesiology to the Medical School offerings.
